Lesson Overview

Materials Needed:

- Notebook or a piece of paper
- Pencil

Activities for Today:

- ★ Sentence Warmup
 - Practice sentence: **"Sleeping helps you learn better."**
- ★ Mindfulness Exercise
 - Balancing exercise
- ★ Sound Workout
 - Sing the ABC Song.
 - Practice letter sounds /d/ and /a/
- ★ Pretend Play
 - Practice drawing circles
 - Mimic actions of turning a wheel forward and backward
- ★ Story Time
 - The Magical Lunchbox (an adaptation of a book written by Manisha Bhise and illustrated by Jayesh Sivan, Kalp Sanghvi, Kshirin Shetty, Niloufer Wadia, Priya Kuriyan, Radhika Tipnis, and Rijuta Ghate)

The learning buddy should:

- Prepare the writing materials.
- Listen alongside the young learner.
- Draw a medium-sized circle in the middle of the page or a piece of paper.



Note: A Learning Buddy or a grown-up is someone who can help the student during class. There are instructions for learning buddies throughout the lesson. It will be best for the student if a learning buddy can assist them while doing the activities.

Sentence Warmup

The children will be asked to:

- Listen and repeat the practice sentence: **"Sleeping helps you learn better."**
- Count the number of words in the practice sentence.
- Know the importance sleeping in learning.
- Present a short acting that shows the practice sentence.
- Answer questions about where and how we sleep.
- Count the syllables of the practice sentence.
- Count the syllables of the word "sleeping."

Mindfulness

The children will be asked to:

- Do a balancing exercise to help their bodies and minds be calm, relaxed, and ready to learn.

Sound Workout

The children will be asked to:

- Sing along to the ABC song.
- Practice sounding out keywords; "dish" and "animal."
- Practice sounding out the sounds /d/ and /a/.
- Identify the words that begin with /d/ and /a/.

Pretend Play

The learning buddy will be asked to:

- Listen alongside the young learner.
- Draw circles around outside the existing circle as if turning a wheel forward and backward.
- Answer any questions/clarifications of the young learner.

The children will be asked to:

- Follow the lead of learning buddy in drawing circles around as if turning a wheel.

Story Time

The children will be asked to:

- Read the story again, "The Magical Lunchbox."
- Understand the concept of characters.
- Identify the characters in the story.
- Draw a picture of characters in the story.
- Show their drawings and share what they know to other family members.
