Lesson Overview

Materials Needed:

- Notebook or a piece of paper
- Pencil
- Six small stones or counters

Activities for Today:

- ★ Sentence Warmup
 - Practice sentence: **"Solar energy uses the sun to make electricity."**
- ★ Mindfulness Exercise
 - Deep breathing exercises
- ★ Sound Workout
 - Sing the ABC Song
 - Practice letter sounds /sh/ and /th/
- ★ Pretend Play
 - Underarm throw
- ★ Story Time
 - Water is Important (an adaptation of a book written by Aashray Saluja and illustrated by Jeyanthi Manokaran, Lily Banerjee, Rajesh Khar, Rijuta Ghate, Ruchi Shah, and Salim Kasamb)

The learning buddy should:

- Prepare the writing materials.
- Listen alongside the young learner.



- Draw one big circle that fills the page.

Note: A Learning Buddy or a grown-up is someone who can help the student during class. There are instructions for learning buddies throughout the lesson. It will be best for the student if a learning buddy can assist them while doing the activities.

Sentence Warmup

The children will be asked to:

- Listen and repeat the practice sentence: **"Solar energy uses the sun to make electricity."**
- Count the number of words in the practice sentence.
- Know the meaning of electricity and solar energy.
- Present a short acting that shows the practice sentence.
- Answer questions about the things that uses electricity.
- Count the syllables of the practice sentence.
- Count the syllables of the word "electricity."

Mindfulness

The children will be asked to:

- Do a deep breathing exercise to help their bodies and minds be calm, relaxed, and ready to learn.

Sound Workout

The children will be asked to:

- Sing along to the ABC song.
- Practice sounding out keywords; "shell" and "throw."
- Practice sounding out the sounds /sh/ and /th/.
- Identify the words that begin with /sh/ and /th/.

Pretend Play

The learning buddy will be asked to:

- Listen alongside the young learner.
- Demonstrate how to do an underarm throw.
- Answer any questions/clarifications of the young learner.

The children will be asked to:

- Follow the lead of learning buddy in doing an underarm throw

Story Time

The children will be asked to:

- Share what they think about the title of the story.
- Read the story, "Water is Important."
- Identify the beginning, middle, and ending of the story
- Draw scenes in the story that show the beginning, middle, and end.
- Share their drawings and retell the story to other family members or friends.
